






## MacOS 7.6 through 8.1 Internet Setup

### Connection instructions for the Macintosh *Internet Setup Assistant*

#### Step 1: Getting Started

Double-click on the  Macintosh HD icon. Then double-click to open the  Internet folder. You will then see an icon for  double-click on this icon.

#### Step 2: Creating a Profile

These steps will guide you through creating a profile that will connect you to Spacestar. Follow these few steps, and you will be online sending mail, surfing the internet, and chatting with friends



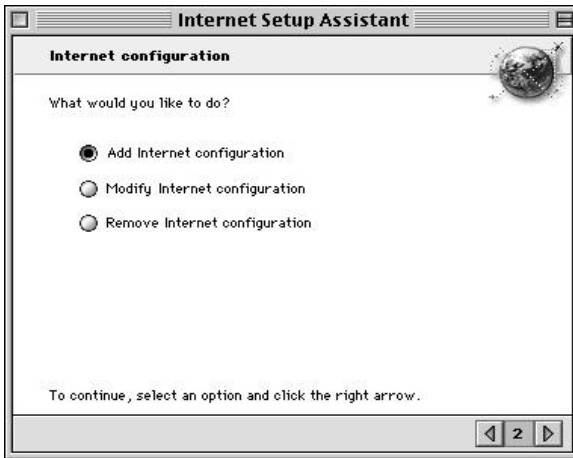
Click on the **“Update”** to add a new profile.



#### Step 3: Introduction

Next, you will then see a welcome screen that explains the services you are setting up. Click on the right arrow at the bottom to continue.

### Step 4: Gathering Information



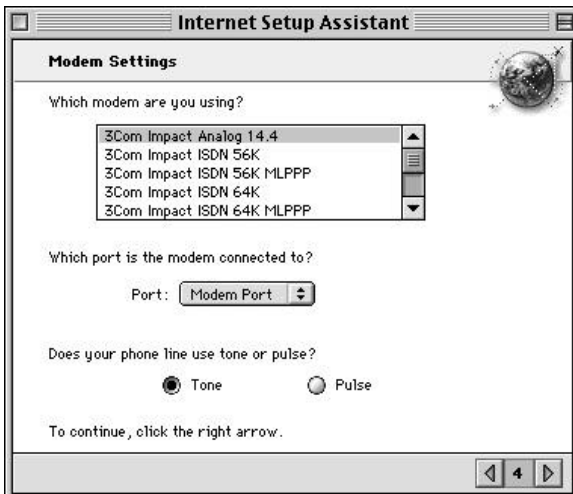
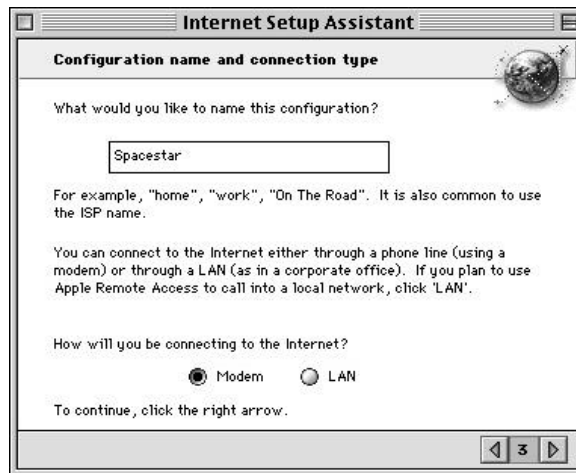
Here is the beginning of the setup process. Select **"Add Internet Configuration"** and click on the right arrow to continue.



### Step 5: Connection Type

Here is where the connection profile is named. In the box where it asks, **"What would you like to name this configuration?"** Enter in the name **Spacestar**.

Under the section where it asks, **"How will you be connecting to the Internet?"** Select the button next to **Modem**. When you are finished, click on the right arrow to continue.



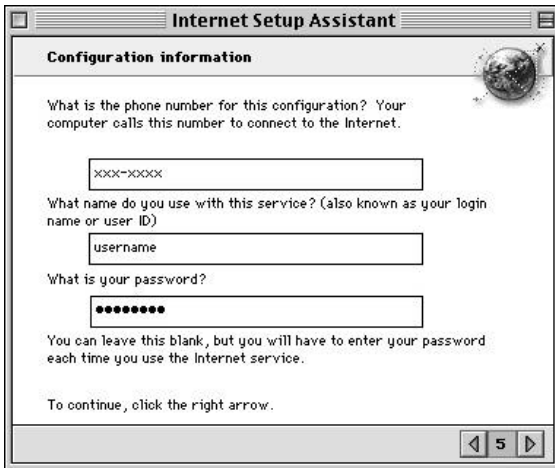
### Step 6: Selecting Your Modem

Select the kind of modem you are using from the list. If you cannot find your modem, select the **3Com Impact Analog 14.4** modem.

**"Modem Port"** or **"Internal Modem"** is normally set for the Port. Some laptops may have an option for **Upper or Lower Card Slot**.

Click on the right arrow to continue.

### Step 7: User Information

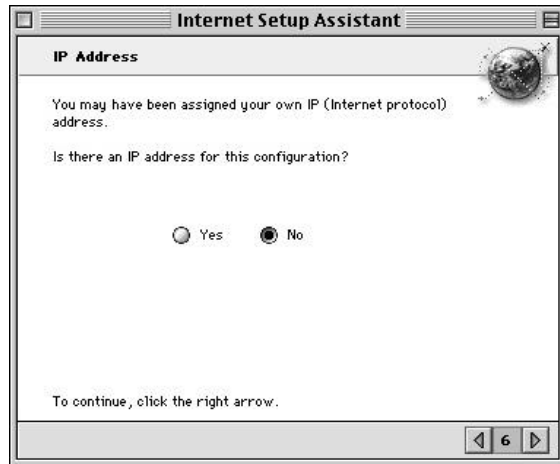


Here is where your dialup information is entered. The first box asks you for the Spacestar Dialup number. Type in the appropriate number from the **Internet Setup Information** sheet provided.

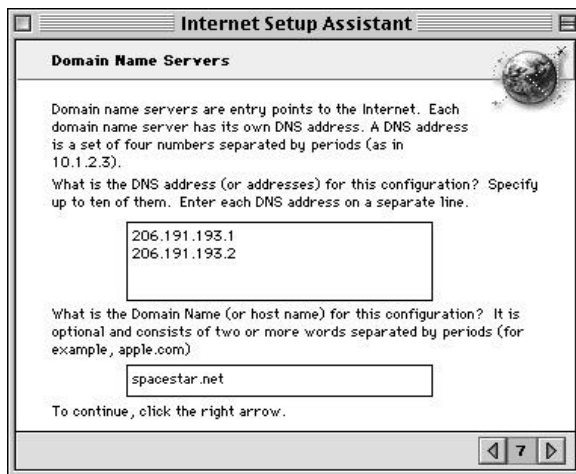


### Step 8: IP Addressing

This screen asks if you are using a Static IP. Most users **do not** have one. Select '**No**' and click on the right arrow to continue.



### Step 9: Domain Name Servers



**Domain Name Servers** are necessary for connecting your computer to the Internet. In the larger box, type in the following sets of numbers:

**206.191.193.1**  
**206.191.193.2**

In the second box, type in **spacestar.net** and then click on the right arrow to continue.



## Step 10: Setting up E-Mail

This is where your mail account information is entered.

**Internet Setup Assistant**

**E-mail address and password**

What is the e-mail address for this configuration?  
This address is where people send you e-mail (for example: chris@isp.com or pat@company.com or kelly@school.edu)

What is the e-mail password for this configuration?  
You can leave this blank, but you will have to enter your password when you want to receive mail.

To continue, click the right arrow.

Type your e-mail address in the upper box.

Next, enter your password in the lower box.

Click on the right arrow to continue.

**Internet Setup Assistant**

**E-Mail account and host computer**

What is the e-mail account for this configuration? (for example: joe@pop.isp.com or pat@mail.company.com)  
This account, also called your POP (Post Office Protocol) account, is where you receive your e-mail.

What is the e-mail host for this configuration? (for example: smtp.isp.com or mail.company.com)  
Usually called the SMTP (Simple Mail Transfer Protocol) host, this computer is where your outgoing e-mail is processed.

To continue, click the right arrow.

This is where your mail account information is entered.

In the top box, type in your POP account using the following form:

[username@pop3.spacestar.net](mailto:username@pop3.spacestar.net)

In the bottom box, type in:

**smtp.spacestar.net**

## Step 12: Setting up the News Server

Here, the setup program is looking for a newsgroup server. In this box, type in the following news server address:

**news.spacestar.net**

**Internet Setup Assistant**

**Newsgroup Host Computer**

Newsgroups are an Internet service you can use to follow or join ongoing discussions on a wide range of subjects.

What is the news group host for this configuration? (for example: news.isp.com or nntp.company.com)  
This computer is sometimes referred to as your NNTP (Network News Transfer Protocol) host. This value is optional.

To continue, click the right arrow.

### Step 13: *Finished*

Congratulations! You're finished!

If “**Connect when finished**” is selected, then the program will open up the **PPP** program when you click on **Go Ahead**.

**PPP** (point-to-point protocol) is the program that is used to dial up into the Spacestar Internet Service.
